In Other Words members have had training, and are off to take part in interviews for prospective new CAMHS employees this month, and we are all looking forward to Quiz Night after the interviews have been safely conducted!

They are also helping to design and create our new safe, calm space, if you or someone you know are a young person with ongoing or past mental or emotional health worries, and you'd like your voice to be heard within CAMHS then please do think about joining this supportive, nonjudgemental group. Deaf young people age 11 and up, we have approx. 10 or more sessions a year, 2-4 hours and usually later on a Saturday afternoon, sometimes in the holidays, with food included. (**A nominal fee may be requested to cover this cost)



Why?

For deaf young people to have time together in a safe social environment without other family members. This is something that it can be hard for deaf young people to achieve as their deaf friends do not always live close to them.

What and Where?

We Aim to have two styles of sessions:

- Activity Club sessions with a variety of activities such as pool, table tennis, kittles, art, craft and cooking. We have a snack tea which the young people prepare themselves and everyone helps clear up at the end of club. We are very close to securing a permanent venue.
- Special club sessions which include parties such as for Halloween and trips out, for example Bowling, Laser Quest, Camping, Trekking.

Our wards have extended their opening times so that you can visit any time between 07:30am – 10:00pm, with the exception of a few areas including, children's areas, maternity and critical care.

In the first instance carers will be offered **free car parking** when the person you care for is admitted to hospital and you are contributing to their care during an inpatient stay. Please approach the ward staff and explain you are a carer and they will be able to provide you with the necessary pass to ensure you do not have to pay parking fees for those days you are contributing to the care in hospital.

We recognise that carers do not always feel listened to or able to contribute to discussions about treatment for the person you care for and may feel shut out and frustrated. Our improvement plan will aim to address some of these issues and ensure staff listen to carers.









FIRST AID LEARNING FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

TEACH THE SKILLS AND CONFIDENCE TO STEP IN DURING A CRISIS.

Do you work with young people aged 10-19 years, or know someone that does?

The British Red Cross are offering free First Aid workshops for established groups in Plymouth. These aim to enable young people to feel more confident, willing and able to help themselves and someone else in a first aid emergency.

There are 18 skills in total e.g. helping someone who is heavily bleeding or having an asthma attack. Workshops can generally cover 4-5 skills in 1.5 hours.
