Have you signed your child up for this Winter's flu vaccine?

You should have received an
e-mail regarding this Winter's nasal flu immunisation.
We do recommend that you use this opportunity to sign
your child up for the immunisation—the form is simple to
use and only takes a couple of minutes.

The immunisations are due to take place in school on 30th November. The closing date for submitting your consent form online is 29th September. If you do not complete your request by that date, your child will not be able to join the

vaccination programme at school, and instead you would need to take your child to their GP or an alternative provider.

If you do not wish your child to have the vaccine, you do not need to do anything.

5 reasons
