Does your child love Cheesy Wheels?

Ingredients

Makes 12 portions 453g puff pastry 453g mashed potato 350g cheddar cheese (grated) 15g mustard powder 45ml semi skimmed milk Salt to taste

Method

- Add the mustard powder, salt and cheese to the mashed potato and mix well
- 2. Roll pastry into a rectangle shape.
- Spread the potato and cheese mixture over the pastry.
- 4. Roll it up so it resembles a swiss roll.
- 5. Cut into approximately2.5cm thick slices
- 6. Place wheels in a tin and brush with a little milk.
- 7. Bake at 200c, 400F, gas mark 6 for 25 to 30 minutes until golden brown in colour.
