We have been made aware by Public Health England that there is a national increase above seasonal levels in cases of Scarlet Fever. Early symptoms include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea, vomiting and flushed





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cheeks. After 12 – 48 hours the characteristic pinhead red rash appears, developing first on the chest and stomach and then spreading. The rash will have a sandpaper like texture.



If your child shows any signs of having the above symptoms, please seek medical advice straight away. A course of antibiotics will be prescribed by your GP. Your child will only be allowed to return to school once they have been receiving medical treatment for a full 24 hour period, this is to avoid the risk of further infection within the school.
