Message from the Headteacher

Another week has gone by and the children continue to remain focused on their learning. We have had pirates invading our Foundation classroom, Ready Steady Music workshops, Clubs continuing, ongoing First Holy Communion classes, our School Council representing the school in the Council Chambers as members of Plymouth Youth Council... and this has all continued in spite of staff absences through sickness and various training courses.

Our year 3 pupils have now finished their intensive swimming programme and ended with some lucky pupils being taught diving skills by Olympian Tonia Couch in the 'dry dive' area at Plymouth Life Centre.



This week some of the Senior Team have been talking to the children about their learning. Some of the answers we received are worth sharing:

- Q. How do you know if you're being successful at this learning / task?
- A. I know I have done well because of my mistakes and I learn from these. I also know how I am doing from the Teacher who explains what I have done well . My written feedback lets me know what to do next to improve

All of our Topics link together (Reading, English and the artwork that was produced in English was linked to topic).

- Q. What would you do if you were stuck?
- A. First I try to work it out, then I ask someone around me and if I still can't I will ask an adult.
- Q. What does feedback mean? (explained next steps)
- A. So, like yesterday we done our English and we was writing our new story map The Strongest Man in the World in a new version and our teacher gave us a post-it note with something we need to improve.
- Q. Are there any places in school you don't feel safe?
- A. The library the pirates are in there!

Next week, we will be carrying out drop in sessions to see what the children are doing.
