## Message from the Headteacher

What another busy week it has been! We began the week with a remembrance liturgy and silence where the children were encouraged to reflect upon the sacrifices made by so many so that we live in peace. Children in all classes showed great respect and reverence during this time of reflection. On Thursday we will be celebrating the feast of Christ the King with a whole school Mass at 9am. You are always welcome to join us for our weekly Masses and the liturgy on a Monday morning.





This week has been Anti-Bullying Week and work in all classes has focused on ensuring that the children under-

stand what bullying is and how we can be kind and show friendship to everyone. The children have enjoyed preparing their key stage assemblies to share their learning with you. Wearing odd socks today has prompted some great discussions about celebrating difference. We asked children to wear blue today as this is the colour of the National Anti-Bullying Alliance.



Visits and visitors enhance our curriculum provision and there have been some fantastic experiences across the school. As part of their WWII topic Upper Key Stage Two visited Plymouth University to investigate sources of evidence from WWII. They gained such a great insight into the local history of Plymouth and Rob Longworth was impressed with their knowledge of the topic.

Michael Morpurgo Class were wonderful representatives of our school this week when they visited the University for an immersive theatre experience where they were asked to give their feedback and suggestions about



resources that will be used in 'The Box' when it opens next year.

Many classes have now begun our new relationships education programme this week. We are all working on Module One, Created and Loved by God. This unit explores the individual. It is rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships. 
