Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you for your support as we try our best to continue with our planned live performances of our Christmas nativities. As I have forewarned you, this could change at any moment. Sadly we have had to cancel some other events in order to minimise the risk of transmission.

I would love to be able to have the hall bursting at the seams with proud parents watching your children perform next week but we have to do all we can to ensure their and your safety as cases continue to rise in school age children across Devon. With Christmas so close, the last thing any of us want is to see this new variant take off and put paid to everyone's plans to get together especially since so many families were unable to do so last year.

The guidance regarding close contacts in children and fully vaccinated adults remains unchanged and those identified can continue to attend school/work etc unless symptomatic. Daily LFTs and regular PCRS are advised if members of your household are positive.

Where this concerns the new variant, Omicron, this is different and close contacts should self-isolate for 10 days, regardless of age or vaccination status.

Face coverings should be worn in communal areas and we ask that parents/visitors to the school wear a face covering when on site; this includes the playground at dropping off and picking up times and will also include all spectators at next week's performances.

Arrangements for the performances and further detail about the safety measures in place will be posted on Class Dojo. Teachers will also be sharing information on Class Dojo regarding times for dropping off and collecting from evening performances.

Once again, thank you for your support; your messages and emails have been greatly appreciated.

Our Catholic Life Prepare

John the Baptist is getting everyone ready to welcome Jesus. He is travelling through the wilderness, making sure everyone hears his important news. We can all prepare ourselves to meet Jesus by turning our lives around; walking away from what we know is wrong and choosing instead to do what is right. God has already forgiven us and wants us to have a new life and a new start.

In the Bible we often hear about people going into the wilderness. The wilderness is a lonely and sometimes scary place but this is where they meet God. Sometimes it is during the most difficult times of our lives and our most challenging moments that we meet God. We come out of those times stronger and with a new, closer relationship with God.

A two-year 'synodal' process is taking place in the Catholic Church from October 2021 that culminates in the final Synod Gathering of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. The overall theme is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission". The Synod itself has been called by Pope Francis to listen to and better understand the views and opinions of the people of the Diocese of Plymouth and other dioceses all around the world. This gives the people an opportunity to affect change in the Catholic Church for future generations. The first phase of the Synodal Process is a time of listening in local churches which takes place in parishes during the Season of Advent.

It follows a pattern of prayer, listening (which is the period that we are in now) and discernment. The word discernment basically means making sense of all the listening that has been collated so that it can be put into themes.

Please join us for our Act of Worship on Monday 6th December. This will be an opportunity for our whole school community to participate in this journey together.

Well done to all who so enthusiastically volunteered and listened to the training given by Mr Turner (PSSP).





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/COVID19 Information

Unfortunately, we still have high numbers of cases in the South West and as a result, schools have been directed to re-introduce certain measures.

We will continue to promote hand washing/hand sanitising, respiratory hygiene, ventilation and touchpoint cleaning.

We will try our best to balance the need for ventilation with the need for a comfortable working temperature but please ensure your child wears an extra layer under their school shirt just in case.

Staff will once again wear face coverings in communal areas and we ask that parents also wear a face covering if coming onto the school site. This will help to mitigate the risks at pick up time which can be very busy in the playgrounds.

We are pausing whole school assemblies for the moment but can continue to hold gatherings for smaller groups eg EYFS, Year 1/2, Year 3/4 and Year 5/6.

We have reviewed our lunchtime provision to minimise mixing between these larger groups.

Staff will continue to do twice weekly LFTs.

Advice on symptoms:

If unwell stay at home and book a PCR. If negative, individuals should still wait until 24hours post fever to go back into a setting. Colds and other non-Covid symptoms are circulating but in the first instance cardinal symptoms should be treated as possible COVID and trigger isolation and testing.

Household siblings of confirmed cases are advised to take daily LFD while awaiting their PCR test results and to continue to attend school (at discretion of parent for primary age children) and recommend daily LFD testing for all close contacts identified by NHS Test and Trace whilst individuals await their PCR results.

Drop off and collection to Breakfast Club/After School Club is at the main red doors to the church.


