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Why Does Attendance Matter?

Despite the current challenges with regard to COVID-19 and the need for children/families to self-isolate in order to control the virus, we feel it is important to remind ourselves of the importance of good attendance at school.

Attending School on a regular basis is the key to your child doing well at school and will set them up with good routines for later life and the working world, as well as giving your child the opportunity to:

- Make lots of friends and feel included.
- Learn new things and develop many skills.
- Increase confidence and self-esteem.
- Improve social skills.
- Achieve potential and fulfil aspirations.

100% attendance = attending school every day.

90% attendance = attending 4½ days a week = 4 weeks missed per year.

80% attendance = attending 4 days a week = more than half a term missed per year or 2 full years missed over the course of their school career

70% attendance = attending 3½ days each week = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

This week attendance at Holy Cross has been really promising given the circumstances. Well done to everyone!
