IMPORTANT INFORMATION—PLEASE READ

You may have heard something in the recent media about an online viral trend that is currently doing the rounds. We would like to share the following message we have received from Plymouth City Council:

"On Line Alert: Momo

This advice is not intended to cause any panic, however aims to raise awareness of a growing concern and to signpost support to reduce risk to children.

Children receive a message request from an unknown number which then proceeds to send graphic images and instructions to harm themselves and others - or the Momo will "curse them".

The avatar for Momo is a haunting image of a woman with grotesque features and bulging eyes taken from the work of Japanese artist Midori Hayashi, who is not associated with the game. This week reports of this presenting in the UK are growing widely.

With urgent warnings being released about the game here is what you need to know about the 'Momo challenge' - including a reminder of how to prevent your children from seeing it. Maintain an open dialogue with your children about what they are doing online and the dangers of viral trends like this one.

Monitor the things your children can access on the internet. This includes activating parental controls and checking search history. Knowing the signs of distress in your child, is also a huge indicator that something could be going on behind closed doors. These include falling behind at school, loss of appetite and being agitated after being on their phone.

Our advice here at Holy Cross is not to bring this to your child's attention, but to remain vigilant and open with communication with your child regarding online activities. If you are concerned about anything you have read above, please contact Rachel, our Parent support Advisor on 225420.

Online security is paramount here at Holy Cross. We want to reassure you that all internet use is constantly monitored, that no child accesses the internet without an adult present and that a child appropriate search engine is used at all times. Holy Cross use the search engine Kiddle which you may wish to use as your search engine of choice at home for any device which your child may have access to.

Kiddle has inbuilt filters to show only age appropriate search results.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

If you have a child attending a school or 6th form and you receive certain benefits, you may be entitled to claim free school meals. Plymouth City Council is able to check your eligibility online, therefore minimising the need to provide proof of your entitlement.

It is of great benefit for your child's school if you are entitled to free school meals as they receive extra school funding for all children who qualify. Please contact your child's school for details of their Pupil Premium Policy. Plymouth City Council have a 5 day turn around for all free school meals applications, and will advise your child's school of the date the free school meals start.
