<u>Please read important message</u> regarding Head Lice:

We have recently had several cases of head lice within the school. Please can we ask the following: -

- 1. Please check your child's hair for eggs (also called nits).
- 2. If you suspect your child has head lice, please visit your local pharmacist who can identify and diagnose if this is the case and who will then be able to recommend appropriate treatment.
- 3. Tell us if your child has been diagnosed with head lice.
- Remember not to send your child to school until he or she has been treated and all the nits have been removed.
