It was so great to see almost all of you at **Parents' Evenings** this week. Thank you for coming and sharing this partnership in learning with us. I hope that you also had the chance to see the work the children have been doing and witnessing yourself the progress this shows.

You will have received a letter from Raymond Friel, the CEO of CAST this week, informing you that the Mary of the Cross Federation will now discontinue as we look to develop a cluster model across the Catholic schools in Plymouth. One of the immediate practicalities will be for Holy Cross now to form its own single governing board. This will probably mean finding four more governors so we look forward to that challenge. 


FREE SCHOOL MEALS

If you have a child attending a school or 6th form and you receive certain benefits, you may be entitled to claim free school meals. Plymouth City Council is able to check your eligibility online, therefore minimising the need to provide proof of your entitlement.

It is of great benefit for your child's school if you are entitled to free school meals as they receive extra school funding for all children who qualify. Please contact your child's school for details of their Pupil Premium Policy. Plymouth City Council have a 5 day turn around for all free school meals applications, and will advise your child's school of the date the free school meals start.
