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Skip2BFit visited Holy Cross this week and gave all classes the opportunity to take part in a skipping workshop.

Children spent 30 minutes as part of the introduction workshop to skipping. The idea behind Skip2BFit is to encourage children to take responsibility to be the best they can be. The focus is on children constantly beating their Personal Best (PB) and continuing to make progress.

Skip2BFit skipping ropes count the skips the children do when they do the 2 minute Skip2BFit Challenge. All children will be given their own in-school skipping rope and will take part in daily skipping as our way to combine fitness and fun.

On a weekly basis children will be given the chance to beat their PB. The data will then be taken from the ropes and recorded on the class challenge charts.

Certificates will be awarded to children for the most skips in 2 minutes and for the most improved.

It was a great experience and a lot of fun (for the staff as well as the children!).





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Learning in Allan Ahlberg

This week, Allan Ahlberg class worked in groups and used their senses to predict what the next English text would be about. The children took on different roles in their groups and collaborated fantastically. They were presented with a range of resources including pictures, photographs, sounds and a short video clip. Using the evidence, they were successful in working together to predict that the next text would be linked to dinosaurs and fossil hunting. They can't wait to find out more!

Symptomatic of COVID-19

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school.

If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, you should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result.

Further action will depend on the result of the test.



LFD Testing

The government is now offering this same opportunity to parents of any school age child. Please visit this website for further detail. lateral-flow-testing-for-households

If you have a positive LFT result, please inform the school at this email: covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk

You and your household will need to self-isolate so you should not send your child(ren) to school.

You should then book a PCR test.

If the PCR test is positive, you should continue to self-isolate as a household for 10 days.

If the result of the PCR test is negative, the children may return to school. Please email us to let us know the result of the PCR.
