It is important we think about the dignity of the refugees and not send second hand items and our drop off sites will only be accepting items that are included on the list that are new.



The Uniform Store Plymouth is a free service for families to kit out their children for school. Through donations of good quality school uniforms, we give these items out to those in need, free of charge – no referral is needed.

We run a pop-up shop in Plymouth City Centre throughout the school summer holidays, and a Click and Collect service that runs throughout the year, where parents/carers can

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COVID19 Information

Update 21st February: 'Living with Covid-19'.

At school we can now

- hold whole school assemblies, Masses and other events.

- no longer wear face coverings in school or in the playground at drop off/pick up times.

- cease routine asymptomatic testing of staff (LFTs).

We will however continue with our hand/respiratory hygiene, ventilation and cleaning regimes as a first line of defence as in the case of all infectious diseases.

We will continue to follow PHE advice whereby staff and pupils who are symptomatic or have a positive C-19 test result should stay off school for a minimum of 5 days, returning after two consecutive negative results on Day 5 and 6. Please let the office know if your child tests positive or is symptomatic. They should have a PCR test if they have a fever, a new, persistent cough or experience a loss of taste/smell.

In the event of an outbreak, we will implement measures in line with DFE/PHE advice which may include the re-introduction of face coverings/daily LFTs or the temporary suspension of whole school gatherings.

Should we need to re-introduce these measures, I will inform you. We will no longer inform you of positive cases.
