
Oracy—food for thought......

Much research has been undertaken that shows that children's language is much poorer than in the past. It has been suggested that technology is playing a part in this. Some schools have reported parents not interacting with their children after school, so children give up sharing their excitement or ideas.

Researchers have dubbed "technoference" as the interruption of everyday interactions; face to face conversations or at meal or play times between parents and their children - whether this be digital or mobile devices.

With our children picking up mobile devices at an increasingly younger age, it is really important that we set good habits within the home, early on. Children take their cues from us for everything else, so it is only natural that they should do the same with device use.

Switch of your devices for a while this half term and see what communication flows between your family.




