Dear Parents/Carers,

So at last we can see a light at the end of the tunnel and the numbers of cases of COVID 19 in Plymouth are dropping! With the increased numbers of people being vaccinated, this paints a much more positive picture.

Of course the first exciting step is to welcome all our children back to school – and we are very much looking forward to doing that on Monday 8^{th} March.

Early next week, we will share with you the exact arrangements regarding times of drop-offs and pick-ups and the systems we will be inviting you to follow so that school can be as safe as possible. It is not likely to be vastly different to our September arrangements or indeed our reviewed January arrangements prior to the announcement of the national lockdown.

Our key safety measures will focus on minimising contact between bubbles, hand-washing, ventilation, respiratory hygiene, enhanced cleaning regimes and implementing systems to facilitate track and trace. Attendance from the 8th will be mandatory and we look forward to seeing everyone again.




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Support for partners and carers
