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

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SAFER JOURNEYS TO SCHOOL



In last week's newsletter, we informed parents and carers that Holy Cross Catholic Primary School is going to run *Safer Journeys To School*, a new road safety campaign designed by the Road Safety Team at Plymouth City Council. The campaign will be launched on Monday 16th May and will be running for a few weeks. One of the key aims of the campaign is to encourage driving parents and carers to park away from the school gates to improve the safety of children who are walking, scooting or cycling to school.

To help parents and carers know and consider where best to park, the map below is showing the recommended nearby streets where parking is allowed and is

for

free. These streets are located within a 400 metres distance from the school, which represent a nice and short walking distance for the children and their parents, especially if

walking through the beautiful Beaumont Park.





To support parents even further in finding spaces to park, Plymouth City Council are issuing parking permits to any parents and carers at Holy Cross which can be used on school days only, at drop-off and pick-up times, and only on Hampton Street and part of Constantine Street.

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Please note that permits can be collected from reception from Tuesday 10th May in the morning. As they are collecting their permits, parents and carers will be kindly asked to complete a very short survey on their journeys to and from school.

We hope that driving parents and carers will find both the map and the parking permit helpful.

Additional details about the campaign process will be shared soon.

Our Junior Road Safety Officers will be starting work next week also, carrying out a baseline traffic survey and raising awareness of the campaign amongst the children.

Did you know?

We're currently running a number of Outreach Vaccination Clinics that are offering COVID-19 vaccinations in community settings such as libraries and community centres.

Our clinics are walk-in only (no booking required) for anyone aged 5 years or older to receive a vaccine. Please note: in order to receive a vaccine, you must be COVID-19 free for 4 weeks if over 18 years, and COVID-19 free for 12 weeks if under 18 years old.

Guidance for children in educational settings included in People with symptoms of a respiratory infection including COVID-19 - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to an education or childcare setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to do so by a health professional.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day, they took the test.

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal

Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting.

We will continue to highlight the importance of handwashing, good respiratory hygiene, ventilation and a robust cleaning regime in order to limit transmission in school.
