Dear Parents/Carers,

We welcome the news this week that restrictions will be eased on the 19th July and that at last, we see an end in sight. We are looking forward to planning a 'normal' return to school in September and will be in touch with you before the 6th September to let you know what that will look like. We will be digesting the new guidance and amending risk assessments and protocols so that everything is in place for our return after the summer break.

We await the detailed guidance from our Multi Academy Trust, Plymouth CAST regarding what changes can and should be implemented following the 19th July but, given that there remains only 4 days from the 19th July until the end of term, we have already been advised that the current protocols and procedures regarding the wearing of face coverings in communal areas as well as our bubble system, will remain in place until we break up on Thursday the 22nd July.

Our Year 6 and end of year events, have been planned with these restrictions in place and so will continue as planned. We can then start afresh in September when we look forward to being able to open wide the doors of Holy Cross once again!

Our First Holy Communion children will celebrate their special event at the Cathedral on Saturday 24th July. Please keep them in your prayers at this special time.

We had a lovely day today with children competing in their 'bubble' penalty shoot-out competitions (see photos overleaf) and I am sure many of us will be watching the match on Sunday night. Whatever the outcome, we will expect all children in school at the normal time on Monday morning. Mums and dads can of course go back to bed!

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COVID19 Update

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to <u>covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk</u> or to **ring the school office immediately**, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. Whilst awaiting the result, we would have to send home the affected bubble(s) and report to Plymouth City Council as well as Plymouth CAST.


Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.

Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. **LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic** – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test. Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result. Further action will depend on the result of the test.
