Dear Parents/Carers,

I would like to start by wishing all our Muslim families **Eid Mubarak**.

This week our GIFT team have been busy in the prayer garden creating a beautiful prayer space where we can sit and quietly reflect on the beauty of God's creation. The children are busy planning Mission Week (see page 4) and have a wonderful project involving every single member of our community including our new children who will be starting in September.

I am delighted to say that we are over-subscribed in our Foundation Stage unit this September, despite the low birth rate affecting school admissions across Plymouth. We have contacted all our new families to welcome them to Holy Cross and our Foundation Stage team will be busy next term visiting nursery settings and preparing the very important transition from nursery to primary school – a huge step for little people!

With Mr Johnson's road map going to plan, there are few changes to our safety measures. Government guidelines continue to advise staggered drop offs and pick-ups as well as minimising contact between 'bubbles'. Staff are advised to continue to wear face coverings on communal areas although we no longer need to wear them in class. MISSION WEEK

Mission Week will begin on Friday 21st May and run until the last day of term, the 28th May. On Friday 21st, the weekend of PENTECOST, we will celebrate the birthday of the church.

The festival of Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. In the Christian tradition, this event represents the birth of the early church.



Pentecost provides us with an opportunity to reflect on those who spread the Word of God by their words, their example and their lives,

just like those first apostles inspired by the Holy Spirit, to go out and speak in tongues to the many people gathered in Jerusalem that first Pentecost.

We would like the children to come to school on Friday 21st May, dressed as an early apostle or perhaps as a saint; or even as a more recent figure who has led or currently leads a life inspired by the word of God. At lunchtime we will have a special Pentecost Picnic, generously provided by CaterEd which, weather permitting, will be eaten outdoors in the sunshine! CaterEd have also offered to bake us a very special Pentecost Cake – we are so grateful as this will make it a very special occasion indeed!

Why have a 'Mission Week'?

At Holy Cross, it is important that we have a shared understanding of our mission: what is our 'why'; our raison d'être? What makes us special and unique? What makes our school different?

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MAYFLOWER 400



Holy Cross Primary School, represented by our Year 3 and 4 children, alongside 15 other schools are going to be forming their very own massed choir for the Mayflower 400 (M400), 4 nations ceremony on Plymouth Hoe, on Sunday 11th July 2021. This event is being organised by Plymouth City Council alongside Plymouth Music Hub. The hub aims to bring 1000 children and adults together. This is of course subject to the continued easing of COVID restrictions and the success of the government's roadmap.

Bikeability for Year 3

We have organised for all children in Year 3 to take part in the **Bikeability Level 1 programme**. The aims of Bikeability are to raise every child's confidence and proficiency when riding a bike out on the road. The course will take place on either Monday 24th May (23 children) or Tuesday 25th May (23 children) and each group of children will receive a 90 minute practical session. The children will be under the supervision of the Bikeability team at all times as well as a member of staff. The aim is to get all the children to achieve the Bikeability Level 1 award. Bikeability for Year 6

We have organised for all children in Year 6 to take part in the four day Bikeability programme. The aims of Bikeability are to raise every child's confidence and proficiency when riding a bike out on the road. The course begins on the 24th May and will consist of groups of children receiving one practical session each day. The children will be under the supervision of the Bikeability team at all times as well as a member of staff. The aim is to get all the children to achieve the Bikeability Level 1 and 2 award.

Balance- ability for Foundation Stage

Foundation will be taking part in balance-ability in the week beginning 24th May. The children will take part in 4 sessions spread out in the afternoons. The school is covering the cost of the course as part of our membership with the Plymouth Sports Partnership. Y3 and Y6 Children will be required to bring bikes and helmets to school. Please complete the separate consent form and return it to school as soon as possible but no later than Monday 17th May as we need to ensure that we can gather all of the equipment we need. 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One of Plymouth CAST's Strategic 5 Year Goals for all CAST schools is that we work towards reducing our carbon footprint. Becoming carbon neutral by 2030 is an ambitious target and it will require real personal and professional effort from each one of us.

COVID19 Important Testing Reminder

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to <u>covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk</u> or to **ring the school office immediately**, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. Whilst awaiting the result, we would have to send home the affected bubble(s) and report to Plymouth City Council as well as Plymouth CAST.

If the PCR comes back negative, we can then invite the bubble(s) back to school.



Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.

Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. **LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic** – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.

Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well. For further information on testing go to:

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should selfisolate until you get the result.







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Further action will depend on the result of the test.
