Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we welcomed our bubbles back and the children quickly settled back into the routines of learning and playing together.

They engaged well with their teachers whilst self-isolating, joining the live teaching sessions and submitting their work through Google Classroom and we are very proud of them!

I continue to work in partnership with Public Health England and Plymouth City Council and whilst I appreciate that it is disruptive to us all, we have been following national standards, as set out by the DfE and PHE in isolating cases and contacts of cases.

Despite speculation in the media, the national guidance within primary school settings is currently to send whole bubbles home when a confirmed case is identified. This is to prevent further transmission, avoid further illness to children and minimise disruption to the school.

We recognise that self-isolation is a challenge for the children involved, for the families and the whole school community and I want to assure you that the welfare of the children has been and continues to be the most important consideration in our partnership discussions.

Across Devon, cases continue to rise and it is important to be vigilant about symptoms. Whilst the three main COVID symptoms are still top of the list, other milder 'cold-like' symptoms seem to be common in cases of this new Delta variant. We would ask therefore that you monitor your children carefully and err on the side of caution, having them tested, should they appear to be unwell.

This week we all had the opportunity to taste the carrots. Next week, we will be tasting peas.



Our librarians were sorry not to be able to visit schools in person this year to talk about the




Challenge, but they've made <u>this extra</u> <u>special video</u> to explain everything to our pupils.

Have your say on NHS and council proposal for a new health and wellbeing centre in Plymouth

Plymouth City Council and the local NHS are working on plans for a new, purpose-built health, care and wellbeing centre in the West End of Plymouth, in the vicinity of Colin Campbell Court.

The West End Health and Wellbeing Centre would include a range of services – which could include outpatient services accessible to people across the city - all under one roof. The new building would not only provide a much-needed modern health and wellbeing facility, it would also help kick-start the regeneration of the area.

A local engagement programme began at the end of May and continues to 4 July, with project partners keen to hear from local people about the services and facilities they think could go in the building. COVID19 Update

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk or to ring the school office immediately, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. Whilst awaiting the result, we would have to send home the affected bubble(s) and report to Plymouth City Council as well as Plymouth CAST.

Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.



Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.

Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result. Further action will depend on the result of the test.



IMPORTANT: Children/adults who have tested positive and have had COVID 19 should not have LFD test or PCR test within the next 90 days.
