Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a case of Maths - Mania this week and we are very proud of the children for showing such resilience! They have been practising their times tables to ensure, not only that they can recall these important number facts **accurately**, but that they can recall them **at speed!** 

Their enthusiasm and their delight in the progress they have made was so wonderful! Knowing number facts and times tables is really important as quick recall of these means that the child can focus on the mathematical reasoning and more involved concepts when solving problems. This not only allows them to make greater progress but it also gives them confidence and more importantly, satisfaction in their achievements. Their smiles today, as the Year 4 children told me how well they are doing, told the whole story!

The Year 5 and 6 children have also been practising hard and the competition between the classes was fierce! I don't think the laptops and Chromebooks were given much time to charge as they were constantly on the go - with children on Times Tables Rock Stars even at lunchtime! Well done to them all!

Safer Internet Day has given the children the opportunity to explore their own use of the internet, ensuring that they use it responsibly, respectfully and critically. Exploring the theme of online respect is always time well-spent as many people adopt such different behaviours when online and say things they would never say to a person's face. Teaching children 'netiquette' helps them to navigate the online world safely and respectfully and how to avoid getting into difficulty. It is important that we teach the children to be tolerant and considerate in both the real world and online and to think about what they post and share. The children engaged well in the discussions and adopted a very grown-up and respectful approach to the issues shared.

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

#### **Update 10th February 2022**

Following the Prime Minister's indication this week that he intended to drop all Covid rules – including the legal requirement for Covid cases to self-isolate, we are awaiting further guidance for what that will mean for schools.

In the meantime, Covid is still causing huge disruption to England's schools, with 320,000 pupils off because of the virus last Thursday, and nearly one in ten staff also absent. In Plymouth the infection rate is still high and school leaders continue to work hard to manage workforce shortage and pupils absences.
