

Auto top-up for school meals to launch soon


What is Auto top-up?

Based on parental preference, Auto top-up will add money to their child's meal account as soon as the balance falls low. Funds are drawn directly from the parent's bank account (via Bank Transfer)

Parents will get increased peace of mind and schools will benefit from decreased meal debt.

Auto top-up has already been successfully tested with parents across the UK.

Please note: Auto top-up is not available to parents who use advanced meal booking services


NEVER HAVE PARENTPAY DEBT AGAIN!
