
Our Catholic Life -Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Eyes of the World – Half term challenge!

CAFOD (Catholic Agency for Overseas Development) has invited all schools to contribute to an art installation called the *Eyes of the World which* they plan to unveil in Cornwall during the G7 summit this June ahead of the UN climate talks in November. As our government hosts world leaders

for discussions about some of the biggest problems facing the world today, we want to remind them that the *Eyes of the World* are on them as they make important decisions about the climate and the future of our global family.

During our Mission Week the children reflected on this and on how they wanted to make a difference and get involved. This is central to our school mission. We want to give our children opportunities to make a difference – to be AGENTS OF CHANGE. Over half term, we ask that they get creative, using their arts and craft skills to make a pair of eyes, which can be added to the giant art installation that will be showcased in Cornwall during the G7 summit.

CAFOD are hoping to get thousands of pairs of eyes from children in Catholic schools across Cornwall, Devon, and Dorset to show the government that the world is watching and hoping they will take steps to tackle global poverty, injustice and the climate crisis.

The deadline, for us to deliver the eyes to CAFOD is **Wednesday 9 June 2021** (the art installation will be unveiled to the media on Friday 11 June 2021).



EAT THEM TO DEFEAT THEM is a campaign from ITV and Veg Power to encourage children to **eat** more veg. 80% of children and 96% of teenagers don't **eat** enough vegetables. This year the campaign is rolling out into 1,900 primary schools with veg tasting sessions, posters, teaching aids and games, and into the homes as **500,000 children will be given a vegetable reward chart and sticker pack, alongside a puzzle book co-created and funded by Public Health England's Change4Life campaign.**

A new report, 'Veg Facts 2021', being released by The Food Foundation and Peas Please Partnership, reveals that almost a third of children between 5-10 years old eat less than one portion of veg a day. The Eat Them To Defeat Them campaign shows how advertising can be used to inspire kids to eat a healthier diet. The situation does not improve with teenagers with only 6% of teenagers aged 11-16 years old currently eating enough veg to hit the recommendations in the Government's Eatwell Guide.

Research conducted by YouGov, commissioned by ITV and Veg Power for the campaign found that 35% of parents worried about their children's diets during the pandemic.





COVID19 Important Testing Reminder

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk or to ring the school office immediately, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. Whilst awaiting the result, we would have to send home the affected bubble(s) and report to Plymouth City Council as well as Plymouth CAST.

If the PCR comes back negative, we can then invite the bubble(s) back to school.



Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.

Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.


Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result.
