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GDPR

Many of you will by now have heard about the new General **Data Protection Regulation** (GDPR) which is a regulation in EU law on data protection and privacy for all individuals within the European Union. It also addresses the export of personal data outside the EU. This new regulation which came into force on 25th June replaces the old Data Protection directive which UK law had been based upon since 1995. In light of this new change in regulation we have had to revise the way in which our information is stored and shared with others. You have already received an updated Consent/Permission Form, together with a Data Sheet, which you should have by now returned to the school office. If you have yet to return your form, please do so as soon as possible.

In light of these new changes, you will notice in this and future newsletters that we will no longer be naming those pupils who have excelled in school that week and who would have received either a 'Wonder of the Week Certificate' or a 'Top Table Award'. These awards are still in place, which the children will receive weekly and parents will still be invited to the celebration assembly. However for GDPR reasons we can no longer refer to them in our weekly newsletter.

It is approximately a five minute walk from school.
