SAFER JOURNEYS TO SCHOOL

As you may be aware, we are launching our new Safer Journeys to School campaign on Monday 16th May at the school. When dropping-off and picking-up your children next week, you will see three parking buddies, which are child-size cut-outs placed outside Holy Cross Catholic Primary School in Beaumont Road holding important road safety messages for all drivers. The parking buddies will be displayed on the School Keep Clear markings and on the opposite pavement where some parents park on the double yellow lines making visibility and walking on the pavement difficult for pedestrians.

In addition, three large banners will be placed on the school site reminding parents and carers of our three main messages:

- parking away from the school gate
- driving and parking in a considerate and legal way
- consider alternative and more sustainable ways of travelling to and from school

We would also like to encourage parents and carers to make use of the map below when planning where to park away from the school gate and within a 400m distance from the school.




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Parking and walking within a 400m distance from the school



Don't forget, for parents and carers that as part of the pilot, we are issuing temporary parking permits to be used only on the Pay and Display zone on Constantine Road and Hampton road on school days between 8.30 to 9.15 and 2.45 to 3.30 only. You can come and collect your permit at reception.



This afternoon, the Road Safety Officer at Plymouth City Council spoke to the children about the campaign during our assembly. A group of keen young volunteers then conducted their first of four traffic observations by the road side to help evaluate this new campaign.

As parents and carers teaching road safety is very important, children copy bad behaviour as well as good one. Please click on the links below for some ideas to help teach your children to be safer on the school journey.
