The school has now settled down into the new routines and I have been impressed by the children's resilience and their wonderful attitudes to their learning. The teachers and staff have been working very hard to deliver a curriculum which engages the children whilst at the same time allows them to identify the gaps in their understanding and knowledge so that they can plan to fill the gaps and help the children to move forward.

Last week, I had the pleasure of visiting each class. The children were all enthusiastic and keen to tell me what they were learning. The gentle encouragement and support they were receiving from their teachers and teaching assistants meant they were keen to try and to have a go even when things were a bit tricky. One child explained that in fact this meant she was learning as if the work is too easy, she wouldn't learn anything new!

This week we had a visit from our Education Standards Manager from Plymouth CAST. He was impressed by the safety measures we have put in place and with the vigilance shown by all staff in order to keep everyone safe. He was also impressed by how settled the children were and with their excellent behaviour and the quality of the learning taking place right across the school.

Hopefully you have all received the letter I sent out by email yesterday regarding the change in trust policy regarding the wearing of **face coverings**. From Monday, staff will wear a face covering when outside their classrooms. We will also wear them at drop off and pick up times and would ask that parents who come onto the playground also wear a face covering. The policy remains unchanged for the children who should not wear face coverings at school.

Lastly, I would like to thank Mr Foster who arranged for the sheds in the top playground to be moved to a more secure position on a more level surface.
