Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents,

It is hard to believe that there are just days to go until we finish another academic year - like no other! We had our highest daily total on Tuesday with 99 pupils back in school. However, a highlight was seeing all the Year 1 and Foundation Stage children enjoying their parties on Wednesday and today respectively. The excitement on the childrens' faces as they were just being with their friends was so wonderful to see. Thank you for bringing them in - I think it certainly will help them to make the adjustments back when they return in September.

Next week is our last full week for the term and our last week for Year 6. 'Parties' continue on Monday for all Year 2 and Tuesday for all Year 3 - from 1.30 - 2.30. It will be so good to see all the children. Please remember that on Friday, we need the Foundation Stage and Year 1 children to be picked up at 12.40 and 12.50 respectively so that we can enjoy a safe assembly for our leavers in the afternoon. We hope our Year 6 children really enjoy their final week in primary school - I know Miss McCalley has planned a very special programme for them and they are really excited about it.

On Monday 20th July, the Year 4 children will be invited to come in from 10.00 a.m. - 2.00 p.m. and be in their new class. On Tuesday 21st July, the same will be offered to the Year 5 pupils. They will be spread across their new classes - effectively three pods running across the Year 5/6 classrooms. The 2.00 p.m. finish then means there is time to thoroughly clean the classrooms.

This week has been very busy working on our Risk Assessments for our full opening in September. It is our intention at this stage to be welcoming all the children back on Thursday September 3rd. Obviously there will be a different timetable for our new Foundation children, but Year 1 - 6 will all be coming back together. From a practical point of view, there will need to be a staggered start and end to the school day to ensure that whole classes remain as a single 'bubble' and that we socially distance between the bubbles. Next week I hope to share what those staggered start and end times will look like.

We are also working on a School Improvement Recovery Plan that will look to support children on their return to school. This will include creating a safe environment for all, mental health and wellbeing, re-engaging learners with learning, identifying gaps and setting goals, and prioritising the curriculum.

Next week will be the last time the school will deliver weekly food hampers. Thank you to the staff who have been doing this every week. For those on free school meals, this will change to a food voucher and you should now receive an e-voucher by email.

This will not only be Mrs Cotter's and my last full week here at Holy Cross, Mrs Coyte has also decided that she will leave at the end of the term. She has been a wonderful Teaching Assistant here for many years and I am sure you would like to join with me in marking her significant contribution here, thank her and wish her all the very best.

On Friday, I am humbled by the fact that Bishop Mark is saying a Mass of Thanksgiving for retiring Heads and Heads leaving our schools. The Mass will be said for Mr Morse, Mrs England, Mrs Cox and myself as well as Mr Friel, who is leaving CAST after two years as our CEO. The Mass is being streamed via the Diocesan website at 11.00 a.m.
