Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a difficult couple of weeks for us all. Thank you for all your support, your emails and your messages and for keeping the lines of communication open. Apologies for not sending a newsletter last weekend but as I am sure you will appreciate, there were more urgent matters to attend to!

Our isolating bubbles have done amazingly well all week; the children have engaged with their learning, joining Google Meets and sending in work to their teachers. The staff have been providing online sessions and ensuring that the children have everything they need in terms of paper packs, chrome books and access to Google Classroom and I am so appreciative of the effort everyone has made to lessen the impact of this outbreak on the learning and lives of our community both in school and at home.

We are also mindful of the children and families who have tested positive and have been unwell; we have been thinking of you all, and praying for your speedy recovery.

Although we will be welcoming our bubbles back next week, there will still be a number of children who continue to self-isolate due to the ongoing impact of the positive cases.

Thank you for taking the rules of self-isolation seriously; it is only by keeping potential infection away from others, that we stop the spread of this horrible virus. Until the end of the 10 day period, a contact is a potential case and we have had new cases as late as day 9.

I continue to meet regularly with our Public Health England consultant and our link Health Protection Officer from Plymouth City Council and all our actions are guided by their advice.

It was so lovely to see so many of you this morning at our Celebration Assembly and we look forward to getting back to 'normal' as soon as we can.

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Learning in Emma Carroll Class



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COVID19 Update

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk or to ring the school office immediately, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. Whilst awaiting the result, we would have to send home the affected bubble(s) and report to Plymouth City Council as well as Plymouth CAST.

Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.



Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.

Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result. Further action will depend on the result of the test.



IMPORTANT: Children/adults who have tested positive and have had COVID 19 should not have LFD test or PCR test within the next 90 days.

Those of you whose children have been self-isolating because there were 'contacts' can have another PCR to check that they are clear and can return to school. This is not something we can insist upon but I am sure you will want to help us all you can to keep us clear of further positive cases.
