Dear Parents/Carers,

We were so proud of all the children this week! We had a very beautiful 'Start of Year' Mass with Father Victor and a visit from our Education Standards Manager, Mr Maslen, yesterday. Not only was he impressed by the children's reading and how well they listened and engaged with their learning, but he was also struck by how friendly and polite they were. Whenever he met children on his way between classes, they greeted him politely and with lovely, warm smiles. They made such a good impression, Mr Maslen is keen to visit us again!

Thank you to those of you who have heeded my advice about parking and access to the back gate through White Friar's Lane. I know that the vast majority of parents are parking away from school and walking rather than looking to park close to the school. However the issue is continuing and residents are becoming increasingly frustrated. White Friar's Road is a **private road** but at pick up time, there may be residents driving/parking so please remain on the footpath and form a line from the clock tower, whilst waiting for the playground gate to open.

Next week, our Year 5 children will be going swimming every morning at the Life Centre. They missed the opportunity for swimming lessons last year and so they are looking forward to the sessions very much. In the summer term, our Year 4 children will have their swimming lessons and we will continue each year to send the Year 4 cohort.

Finally, please could I ask you to check your Parent Pay accounts and ensure your payments are up to date? The school is owed over £4000 for dinners, Breakfast Club and After School Club. It is worth remembering that once your child moves from Year 2 into Year 3, school dinners must be paid for unless you are eligible for Free School Meals. If you think you might be eligible please visit Apply for Free School Meals and register. Breakfast and After School Club can only be run if financially viable and it would be a great shame if we could no longer offer this valuable provision as we want to be able to help parents as much as we can.

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**In Year 1 and 2**, we have been exploring our local area using aerial views. We created messy maps of a local landmark. Can you guess what it is?





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

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#### **COVID19 Information**

As Lateral Flow Testing continues in schools and homes, could we remind you to report any positive results to <a href="mailto:covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk">covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk</a> or to ring the school office immediately, with self-isolation taking place until a confirmatory PCR test result is received. If the PCR comes back negative, your child can return to school. If the PCR is positive, your child will need to isolate for the full ten days from the onset of symptoms or the date of the test is asymptomatic. Any positive PCR tests should also be shared with us along with the date of the positive test.

#### The guidance has now changed.

If a child or member of staff tests positive, NHS track and Trace will carry out contact tracing. Close contacts will be contacted by NHS Track and Trace and advised appropriately.

If there is a positive case in school, we will inform the parents of the affected class **but** we will not do contact tracing or send whole classes home.

If not contacted by NHS Track and Trace, you can assume that your child has not been identified by them as a close contact.

**However,** we all know how closely children interact within the classroom so we would advise you to book a PCR test for your child when informed of a positive case in their class. They can continue to attend school whilst waiting for either the test or the result. If the PCR is positive, then they should isolate. We would also advise you to be vigilant and to monitor your child for symptoms if informed of a positive case within their class. They should not attend school if they develop symptoms and should book a PCR test immediately.

You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. **LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic** – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.

Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school.

If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result. Further action will depend on the result of the test.

Ensure the case isolates for 10 days. Household of the case isolates for 10 days (unless fully vaccinated or aged under 18 years and 6 months).

If positive test came from an LFD test, case should take a confirmatory PCR test within 48 hours of the LFD.

#### Student/child:

Following a PCR positive, NHS Test and Trace (T&T) will speak to the case (or their parent/carer) to identify close contacts and provide testing and isolation advice as required. NHS T&T will advise close contacts to get a PCR test.

#### Staff:

Settings should identify any close contact co-workers and report these to the Selfisolation Self Service Hub (020 3743 6715). NHS Test and Trace will then make contact to advise on isolation (if not fully vaccinated) and testing.

Staff and children who do not need to isolate should continue to attend school as

normal.

Clean and disinfect rooms the case was using - ensure appropriate PPE (see right) are used.

Cases & any isolating contacts can return once the isolation period is completed (so long as well).

If the CONFIRMED case has not been in the setting during the infectious period (2 days before symptoms to 10 days after) then no further action needs to be taken by the school
