Dear Parents/Carers,

Another busy week bursting with new learning and the children are now well and truly settled back into our school routines following their Easter holiday.

As we move further into the summer term, the danger of 'the lost jumper' becomes more of a challenge. As you know, we continue to operate in class bubbles and due to COVID restrictions, we are not gathering lost property in any one single area. Children are reminded by staff to collect jumpers and coats when leaving the playground so that they are brought back to their classrooms. When this doesn't happen, we can re-unite lost jumpers with their owners quite easily and quickly if names are clearly written on the label. Without names, this becomes an impossible task unfortunately and we end up with sad children, sad jumpers and sad mums and dads!

Please could I ask that you check your children's jumpers and make sure their name is clearly written on the labels. After washing, it is worth checking that the name hasn't washed away. 
JK Rowling: Evan for consistently showing what it is to be a good role model and how to work hard whilst being humble.

Staggered Drop offs and Pick ups

Please note that no cars should drive down White Friars Lane and that we request parents/carers wear face coverings on the school site.

Symptomatic of COVID-19

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, you should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result.



Further action will depend on the result of the test.

LFD Testing

The government is now offering this same opportunity to parents of any school age child. Please visit this website for further detail. lateral-flow-testing-for-households

If you have a positive LFT result, please inform the school at this email covid@holycross.plymouth.sch.uk

You and your household will need to self-isolate so you should not send your child(ren) to school.

You should then book a PCR test.

If the PCR test is positive, you should continue to self-isolate as a household for 10 days. If the result of the PCR test is negative, the children may return to school. Please email us to let us know the result of the PCR.
