Secondary School Admissions - September 2022.

IS YOUR CHILD DUE TO START SECONDARY SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2022?

It may seem a long way ahead but now is the time to start thinking about your child moving from primary school onto secondary school. If your child was born between 1 September 2010 and 31 August 2011 you will be eligible to apply for a secondary school place.



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Information about applying for a place and the individual secondary schools will be on our website from Monday 6 September 2021 at www.plymouth.gov.uk/schooladmissions. Fror here, you can apply online for school places and read the guide for parents which contains the links to the individual schools admission policies and forms.

Applying online is quick and easy - all you need is an email address. Once you have applied we will let you know which school your child has been allocated on Tuesday 1 March 2022.

Remember:

- All Plymouth's 18 secondary schools hold 'open events' for families to visit the school and speak to staff. Please refer to the individual schools websites for dates and further information.
- If you are applying for a place at a faith school on faith grounds, you must also fill out a supplementary form, which you can obtain from our website or from the school.
- Some schools give priority to children of members of staff and will ask for submission of a supplementary form as proof.
- Please read the admission policy for each school carefully.

If you are applying for a place at a girl's grammar school, you must register to take the 11-plus examination through our website. For boys grammar school please refer to the schools website. The closing date for registering both boys and girls is 31 August 2021.




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COVID19 Update

Friday 16 July 2021



COVID-19 cases across Devon are increasing, which is to be expected given the easing of restrictions and greater freedom for people to socialise.

The highest rates remain in young age groups, mostly within younger working-age adults. This is reflected in Teignbridge which has a younger age population profile than the rest of Devon.

The weekly rate in Devon is now 240 per 100,000 of the population. Most areas are still below the national average (350), except Teignbridge, which is just above (352).

Please remember that if an individual (child or adult) has any of the COVID19 symptoms a PCR test should be booked straight away. Use this link to book: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. You should not take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test if you are symptomatic even if LFD testing is part of your routine. LFD tests are for people who are asymptomatic – i.e. not showing any symptoms. If you are not sure whether you have one or more of the symptoms then book a PCR test.

Please note that this applies to anyone in your household as well.

If your child presents with a new continuous cough, a fever or is experiencing any loss of or change in their taste/smell, please do not send them to school. If your child presents with any of these symptoms while at school, we will call you immediately. You should have your child tested and the whole household should self-isolate until you get the result. Further action will depend on the result of the test.



IMPORTANT: Children/adults who have tested positive and have had COVID 19 should not have LFD test or PCR test within the next 90 days.
